The Little Bear Saved By *Healing Light* ©

South Dakota Doctor's Invention Saves Cub Bear's Life

This is a not a nursery rhyme story about Poppa Bear, Momma Bear and Baby Bear, but a true story about Baby Bear who had a tragic accident...but a very happy ending!



Baby Bear, a black bear cub, was found **unable to move at the base of a large oak tree in Minnesota** by landowner Gary Mathis. An officer from the Department of Natural Resources recommended that Baby Bear be destroyed. Mathis. **A veterinarian was consulted and his report was grim saying that if Baby Bear had broken his back in the fall from the tree, surgery was not an option.**

Under “normal” circumstances, Baby Bear’s life would have tragically ended at that point – which, I think you would agree, is not much of an ending for a “Baby Bear” story.

MathisMathisMathis remembered his chiropractor owned a low level laser called the Q1000. He called him to see if he would help Baby Bear. Donna Keogh, the wife of the chiropractor and a lover of animals, agreed.

She called Dr Larry Lytle, Low Level Laser Consultant and author of *Healing Light*, for advice.
